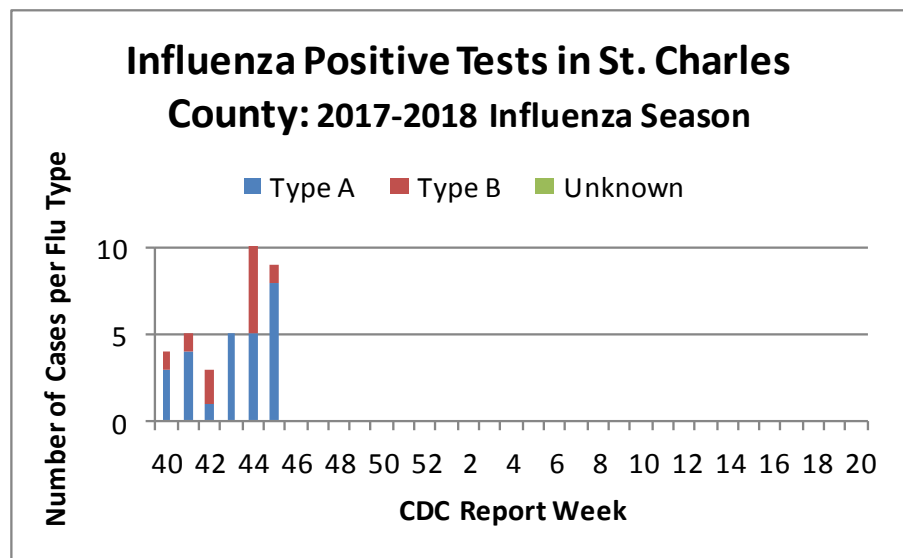

There were **9 cases** of influenza reported in week 45 to the St. Charles County Department of Public Health in 2017.

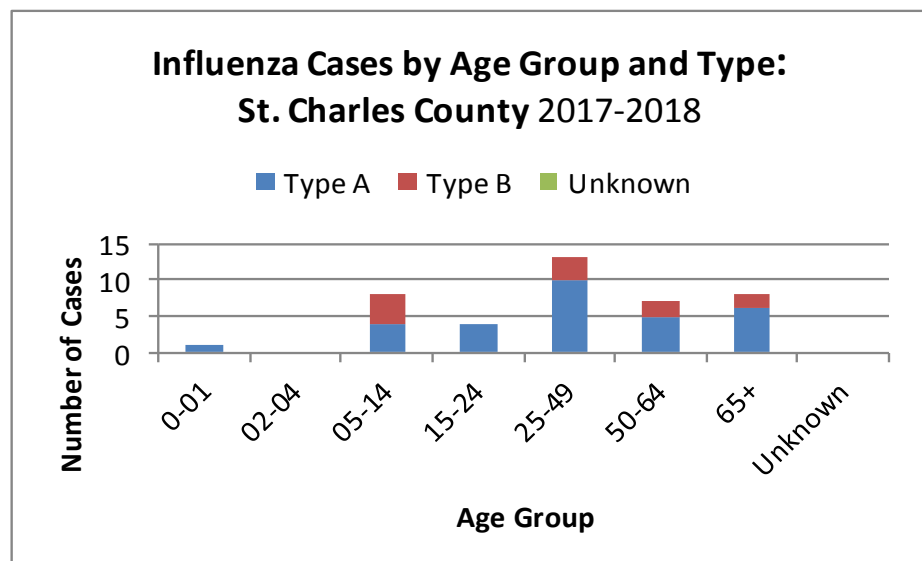

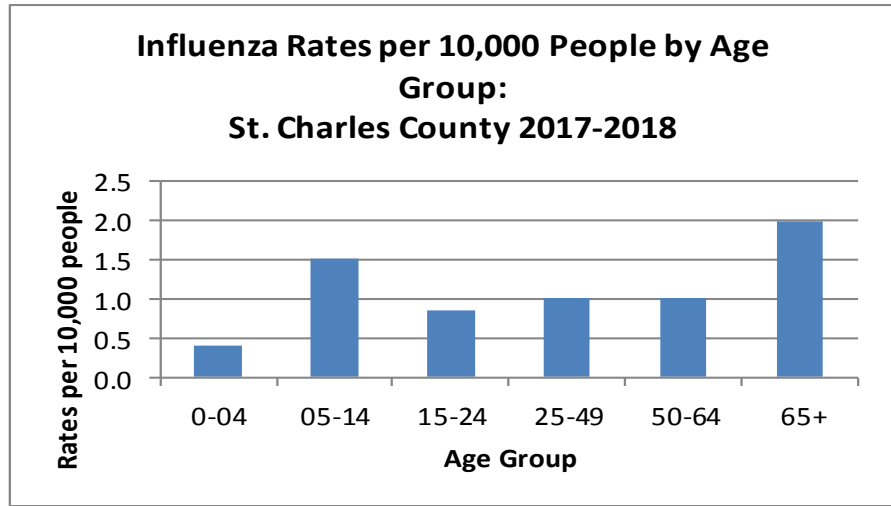
INFLUENZA SURVEILLANCE REPORT

How long can a person spread the flu virus?

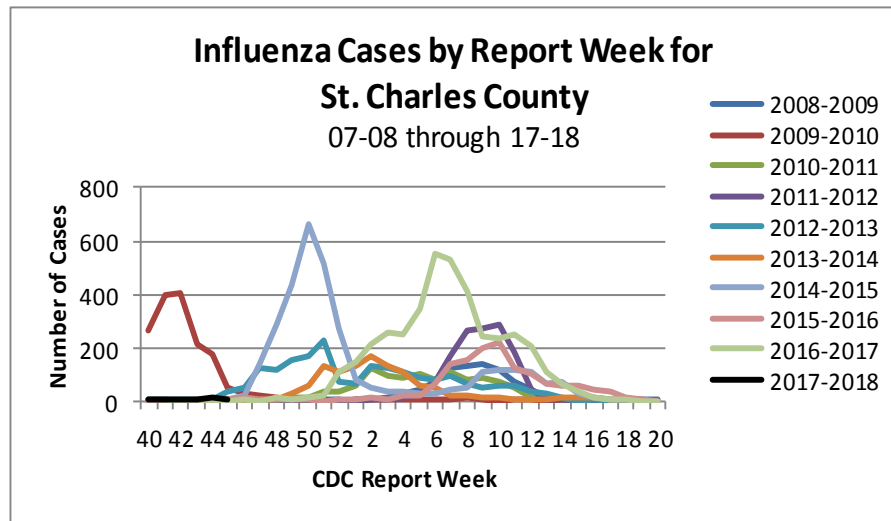
Most people may be able to spread the flu from 1 day before showing symptoms to 5 to 7 days after symptoms begin.

Severely ill persons or young children may be able to spread the flu longer.

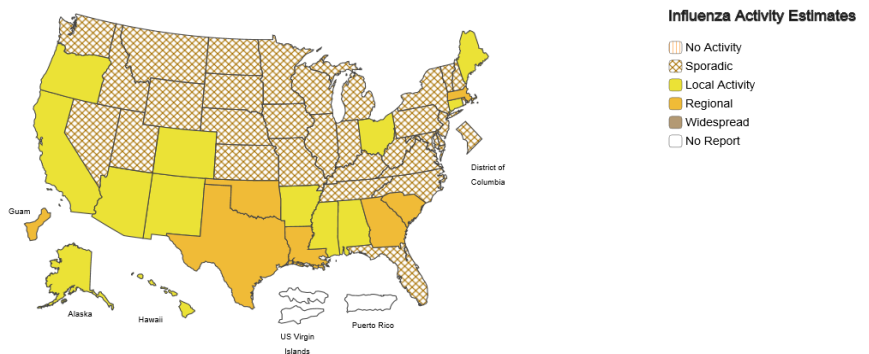
