CALL TO ORDER, ROLL CALL AND DECLARATION OF QUORUM

Danny Kluesner called the meeting to order at 1:58 p.m. There was a quorum of Board members present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Danny Kluesner asked for a motion to approve the minutes from March 9, 2023 meeting. The motion was made by Nathan Dunkmann and was seconded by William Schaul. The minutes were approved by unanimous voice acclamation.

CHANGES TO THE AGENDA

There were no changes to the agenda.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

There were no public speakers.

PRESENTATION

Presentation of Updated Stormwater and Water Quality Regulations by Josh Rivers, Program Coordinator, Development Review Division

Josh Rivers from Development Review Division talked about recent Post-Construction Stormwater Management Regulations that were enacted in 2021 that affected water quality, channel/erosion protection and overbank and flood protection. Josh cited that these regulations are two years old and are being evaluated. Discussions with HOA's have been held to discuss ways to allow infiltration and modified soils on residential lots. In addition, Josh Rivers said ways to provide more water quality credits for conservation is being sought. A brief question and answer session was held. Mark Price said that Development Review will be participating more frequently at meetings in the future.

OLD BUSINESS (UPDATES)

- ◆ U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Upper Mississippi River Comprehensive Study (Plan H)

There were no updates.

- ◆ Update regarding funding for a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)

Mark Price, St. Charles County Senior Planner stated that it is expected that the County will get a release to begin to spend money next week which will permit hiring a consultant. He explained requests for proposals are being reviewed from four companies that have submitted RFPs and applications could be taken in about two to three months. Nathan Dunkmann asked if these funds could be used for flood prevention for the Marais Temp Clair Drainage District. Mark Price stated that funds are intended for home buyouts.

NEW BUSINESS

- ◆ Discussion Regarding Grant Availability for the Marais Temp Clair Drainage District

Nathan Dunkmann said a meeting was held to invite neighbors that had not attended previous meetings and provide them with information about the proposed project. He added the meeting went well and attendees were encouraged with the proposal. Mark Price noted that the requested drainage district is a federal process and will move along slowly. Nathan Dunkmann stated there is a plan, but funds are needed.
