Your Input Is Needed! Residents Invited To Take Survey To Help Develop New County Park Property

St. Charles County, Missouri – To assist St. Charles County in developing the new park property recently acquired between Pitman Hill and Kisker Roads, residents are invited to take a quick survey about amenities they would like to see in the park.

On July 17, St. Charles County announced the acquisition of this property, which is the former Sammelmann Farm and Homestead, as its newest proposed county park. The farm features three tracts totaling 116 acres and is bordered by Pitman Hill Road and Kisker Road in the Weldon Spring area. The Sammelmann Farm and Homestead is the sixth St. Charles County Park in reserve for future development, which increases the total land reserved for County parks to 3,156 acres.

The St. Charles County Parks Department currently has 10 parks open to the public - Broemmelsiek Park (south of O'Fallon), County Heritage Museum at Heritage Park (in St. Peters), Hideaway Harbor Park (near Portage des Sioux), Indian Camp Creek Park (near Foristell), Louis H. Bangert Memorial Wildlife Area (in St. Charles), Klondike Park (in Augusta), Matson Hill Park (in Defiance), Quail Ridge Park (in Wentzville), Towne Park (north of Wentzville) and the Youth Activity Park (in Dardenne Prairie).
