people and wildlife. The St. Charles County Parks and Recreation Department invites adults and children ages 6 and older to learn all about pollination at “Pollinator Party” from 1–2:30 p.m., Saturday, April 20, at Towne Park, 100 Towne Park Drive in Foristell.

At this new hands-on program, participants learn facts about pollination, play a game to learn how bees help our planet and see first-hand how pollinators assist with producing the food we love to eat! It’s also a good resource for scouts looking to obtain a pollination badge.
