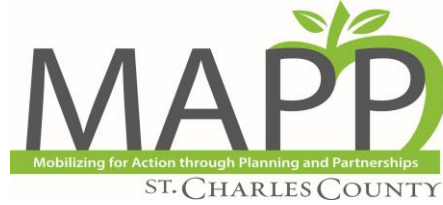
Vision Statement:
